Winterize Your Houseplants

If your houseplants have been summering outside, follow these steps for a smoother transition from outdoors to inside your home:

- 1. In September, start a pest control program to keep unwanted insects from hitching a ride into your house and infesting other plants. Spray plants a couple of times with ferti*lome Triple Action or ferti-lome Indoor/Outdoor Multi-Purpose Insect Spray to make sure plants are free of pests. Spray the soil as well as the plant itself. Water monthly with ferti*lome 20-20-20 All Purpose Water Soluble Plant Food, ferti-lome liquid All Purpose Houseplant Food or Nature's Source Plant Food to maintain good color.
- 2. Prepare to move plants indoors before nights get as cool as 50°F.
- 3. Wash plants with water to get rid of remaining insects and disease spores.
- 4. Houseplants will need repotting if these conditions are present:
 - Plants wilt rapidly after watering.
 - Soil dries out quickly.
 - Roots appear on soil surface.
 - Decreasing leaf size on new growth.



- 5. Repotting hints:
 - Use ferti•lome Ultimate Potting Mix for optimum growth and drainage.
 - New pot should be no more than 2" wider than the old pot.
- 6. Spray again with *ferti-lome Triple Action Insect Spray* or fertilome Indoor/Outdoor Multi-Purpose Insect Spray to make sure plants are free of pests.
- 7. After spraying, put down a soil application of *Hi-Yield Systemic Insect Granules* to systemically control sucking insects.
- 8. Prune dead or spindly stems and foliage to encourage compact, bushy growth.

- 9. Fertilize lightly with *ferti*lome 20-20-20 All Purpose Water Soluble Plant Food, liquid ferti-lome All Purpose Houseplant Food* or *Nature's Source Plant Food* during the winter months, returning to a regular fertilizer schedule in spring, summer and early fall.
- 10. Fungus gnats can become a nuisance inside during the winter. Adults look like fruit flies and lay their eggs in potted plants. Larva hatch out in moist soil so always use a well draining potting mix like ferti-lome Ultimate Potting Mix and let plants dry between waterings. Adults can be controlled with yellow sticky traps. Larva can be killed by spraying ferti-lome Triple Action on the soil several times. A layer of rice hulls or sand as a top dressing will keep the soil surface dry and unreceptive to fungus gnats.
